Morning Brew *

Frequency: Daily (morning)

The gold standard of entertaining, informative, and readable newsletters. If you pick one on this list, this is it. Interesting stories every day with concise information and links to sources. There are also sub-newsletters for emerging tech, retail, and politics.

Stocktwits *

Frequency: Daily (after market close)

Quick and to the point, this one gives an overview of the day's market activity. It's based off a twitter page, so not as official as the rest, but it provides insight from traders and often has interesting information about particular sectors that is not in the others.

Dealbook NYT *

Frequency: Daily (morning)

More comprehensive (and a bit more technical) information, this one provides more information about firm activity, board changes, proposed deals, activist investors, and other financial news.

Street Sheet

Frequency: Weekly (Sunday)

If you are interested in not receiving emails as frequently, this weekly one provides less detail, but good big picture summaries of the week's financial activity. It is more useful if you have some idea of the week's events.

New York Times Morning Briefing

Frequency: Daily (morning)

This encompasses basic news, not business specific but usually has business implications and covers major financial activities. Pretty standard.

The Water Coolest

Frequency: Daily (morning)

Very similar to Morning Brew, this one is a bit more casual and typically has a bit less information.

Byers Market NBC

Frequency: Daily (morning)

Similar to Dealbook.
